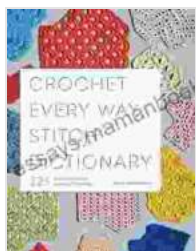

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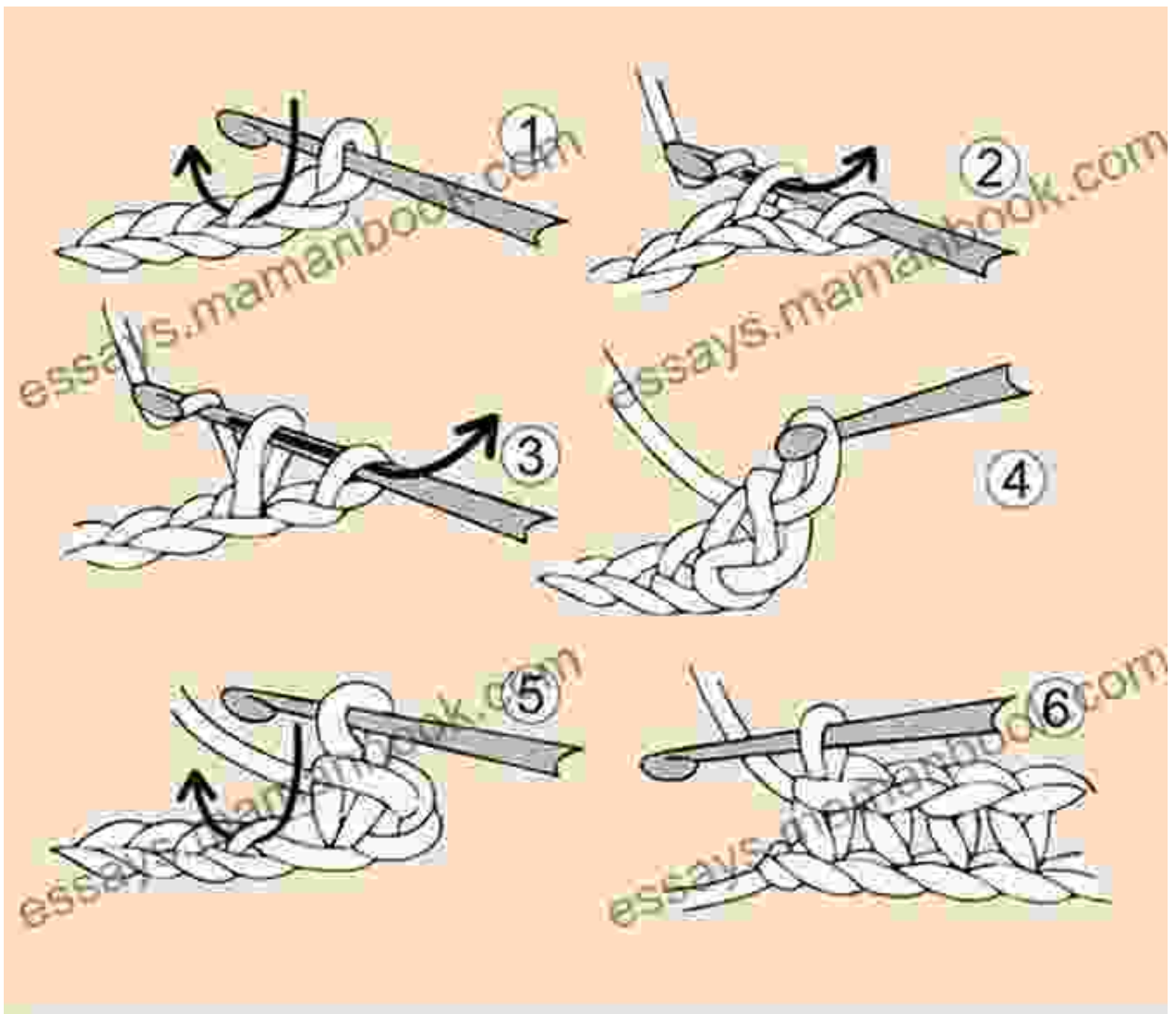


Chapter 1: Foundation Stitches

HOW TO MAKE THE
FOUNDATION **H**ALF **D**OUBLE **C**ROCHED

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1 On 2, yo, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook, yo and draw up a loop

2 Yo and draw through 1 loop (1st "chain" made)

3 Yo and draw through 3 loops on hook (1st hdc made)

4 Yo, insert hook under 2 loops of the "chain" just made

5 Yo and draw up a loop

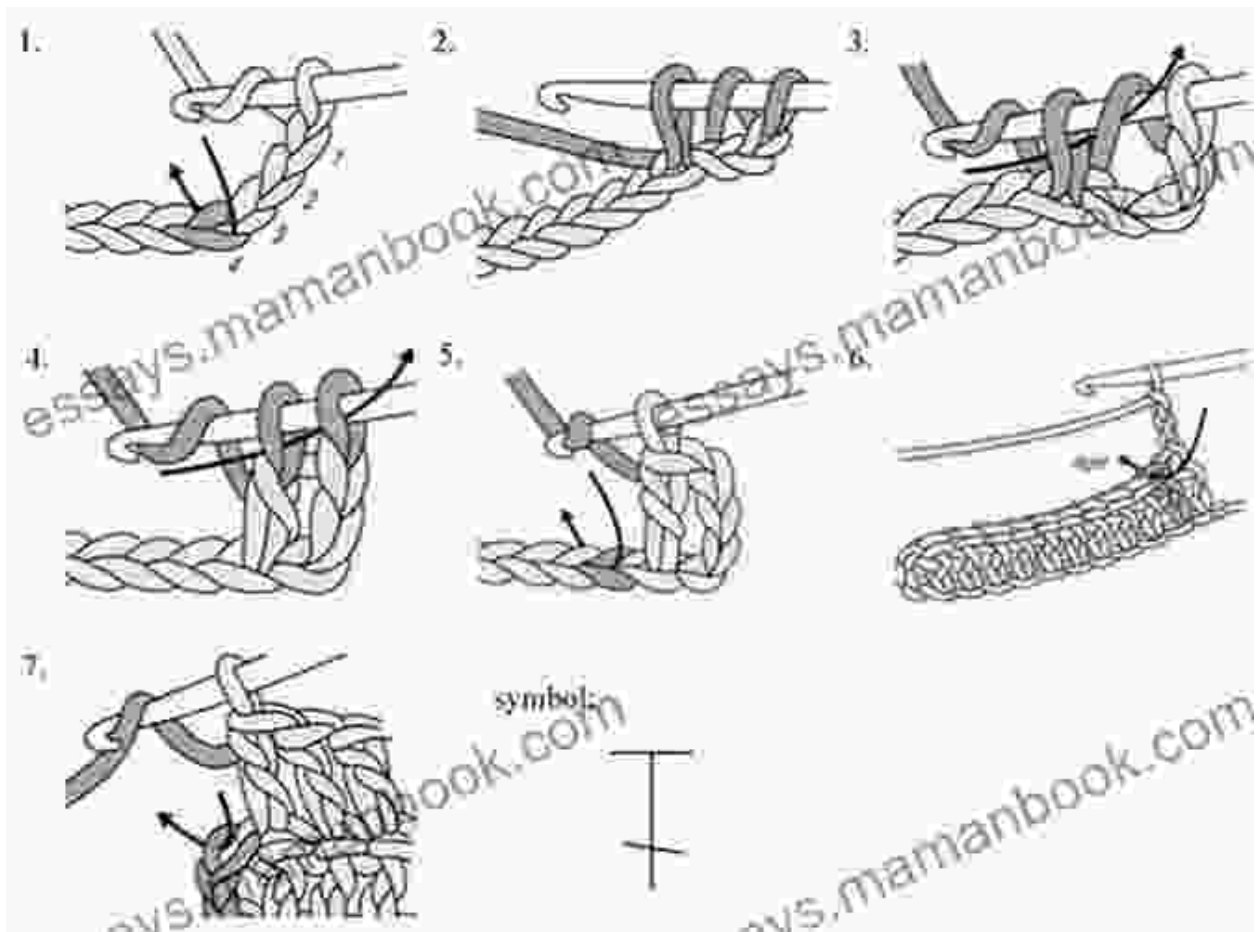
6 Yo and draw through 1 loop ("chain" made)

7 Yo and draw through 3 loops on hook (hdc made)

Repeat steps 4-7 for desired number of foundation stitches.

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Chapter 2: Joining Stitches

Joining stitches are used to connect pieces of crocheted fabric. In this chapter, you'll learn how to make a slip stitch, single crochet join, and half double crochet join. These stitches are essential for creating larger projects, such as garments and blankets.

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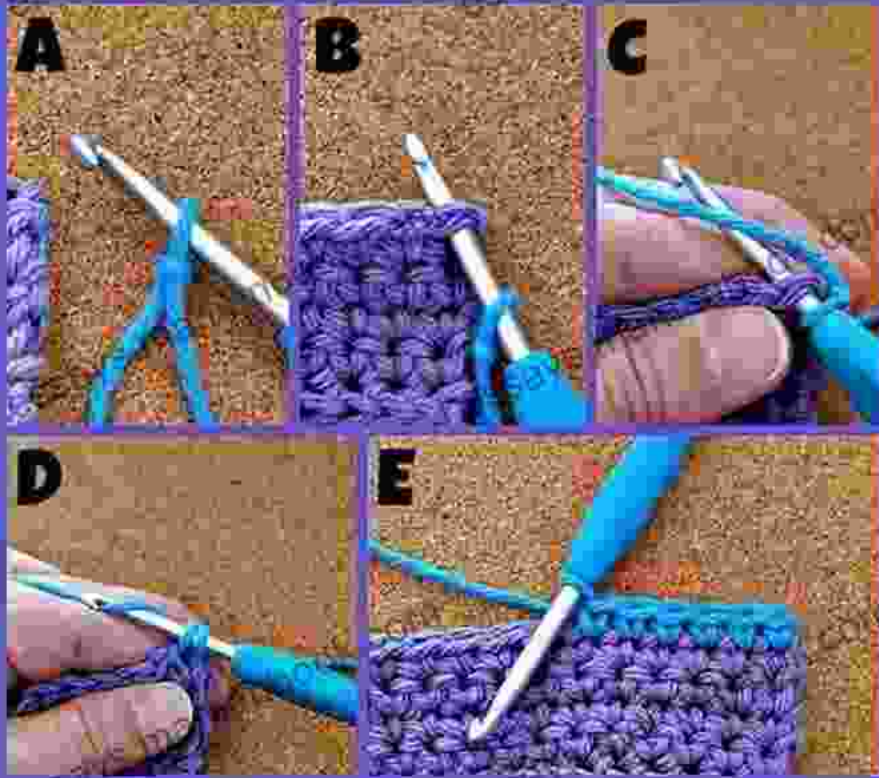
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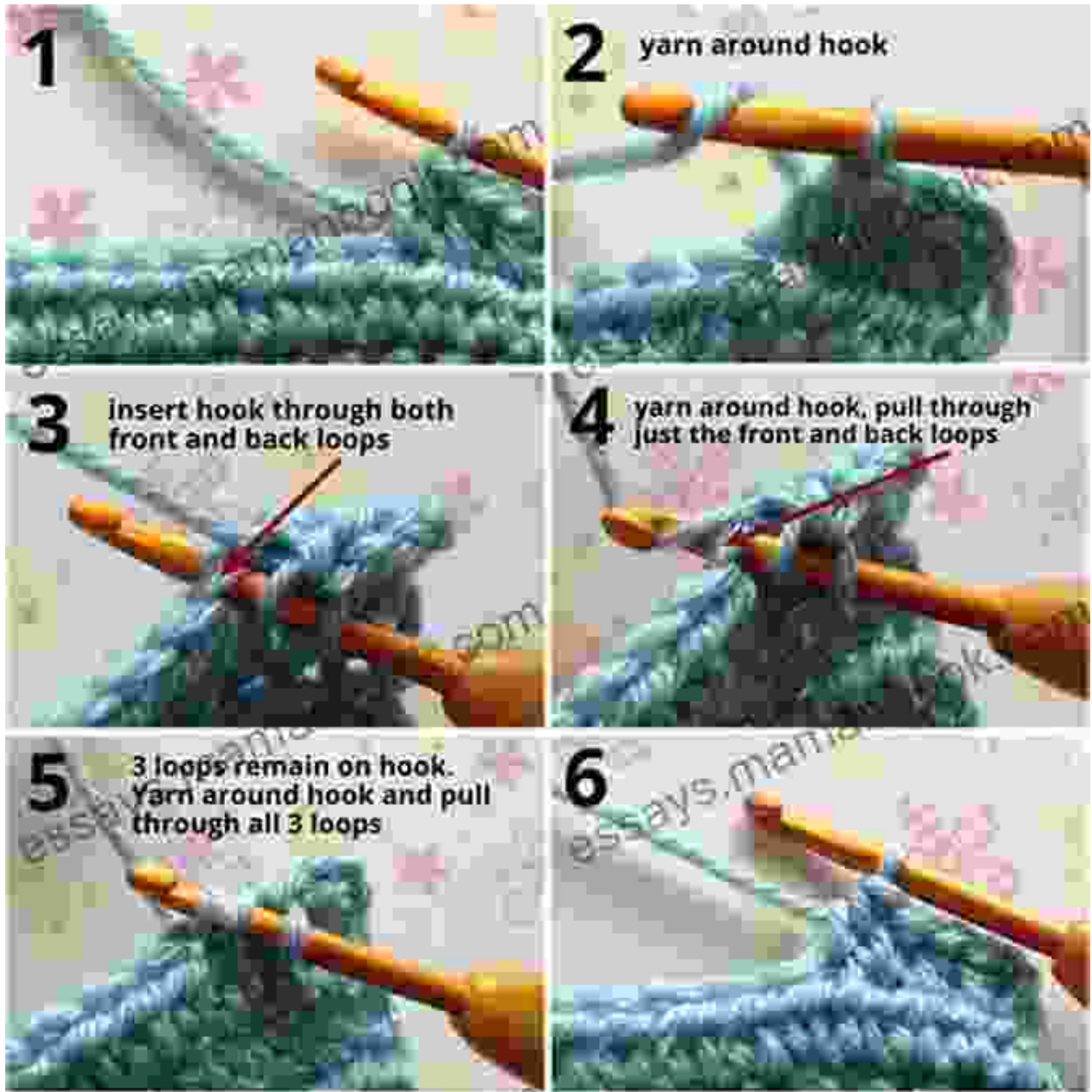

Chapter 3: Finishing Stitches

These stitches are used to secure the ends of your crocheted fabric and prevent it from unraveling.

Kitchener Stitch

FRONT NEEDLE

1 "Knit OFF"

Knitwise into 1st stitch on FRONT NEEDLE

Stitch comes OFF



2 "Purl"

Purlwise into 1st stitch on FRONT NEEDLE



BACK NEEDLE

3 "Purl OFF"

Purlwise into 1st stitch on BACK NEEDLE
Stitch comes off



4 "Knit"

Knitwise into 1st stitch on BACK NEEDLE



Repeat 1-4



SETUP

Cut a 15-inch tail
Thread onto
tapestry needle



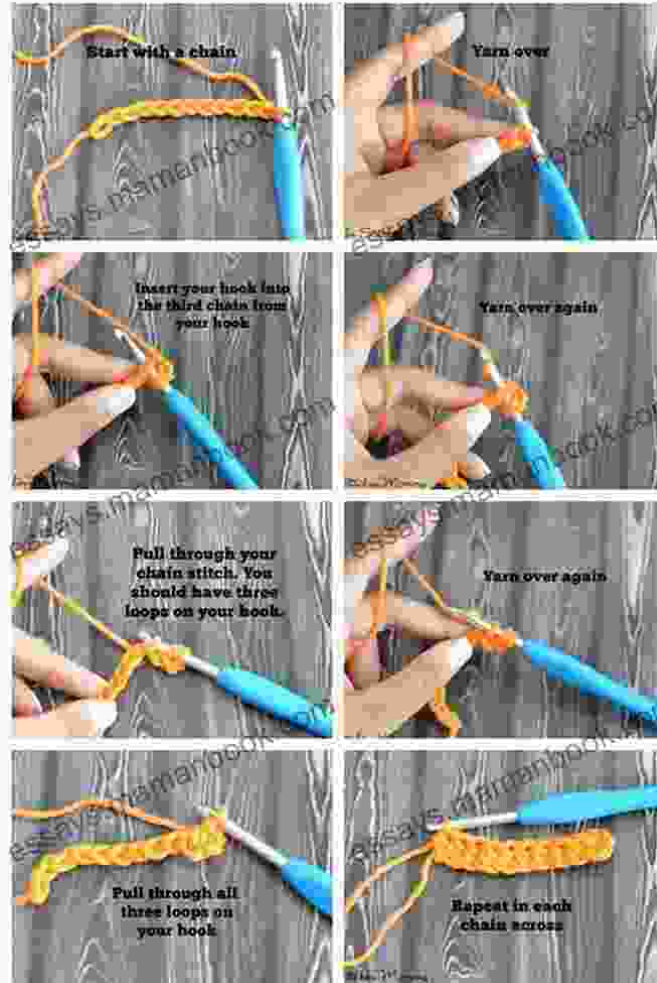
Do steps
2 and 4 once.

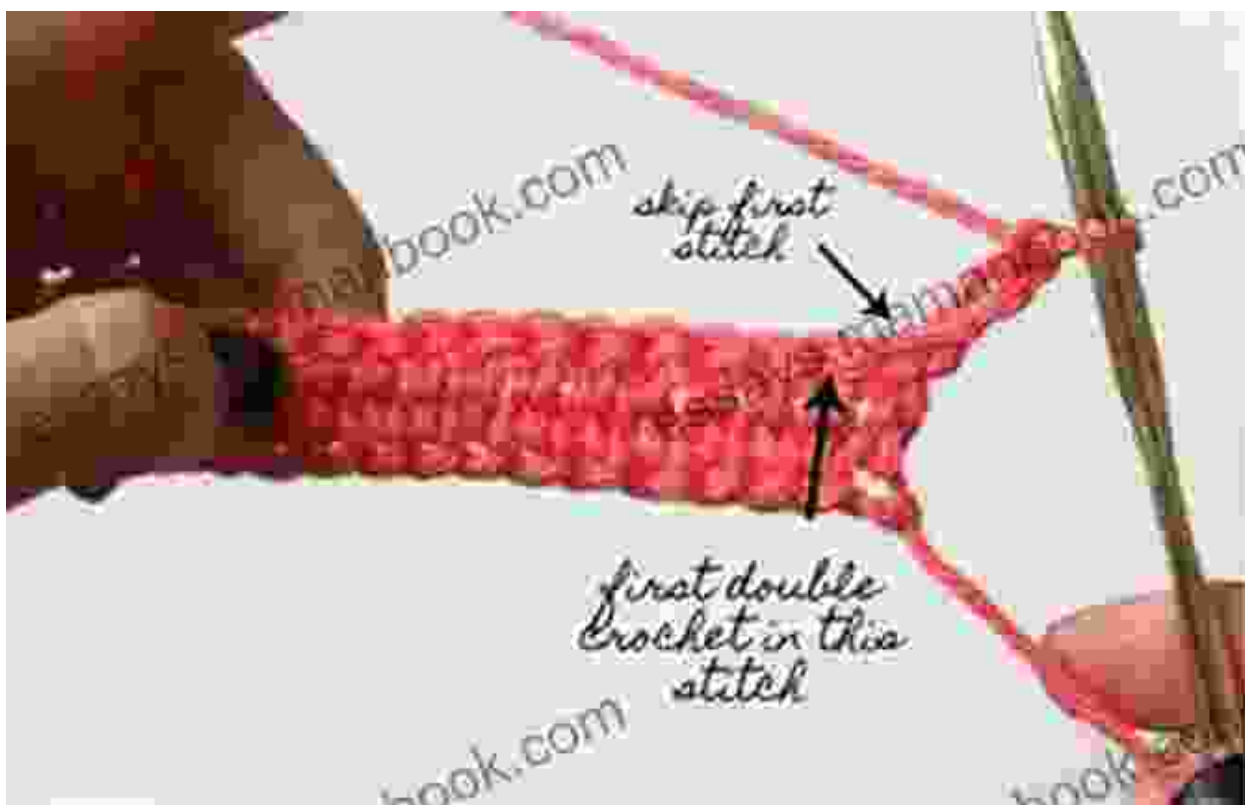

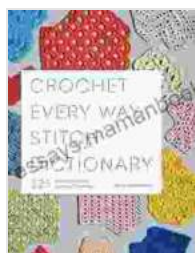

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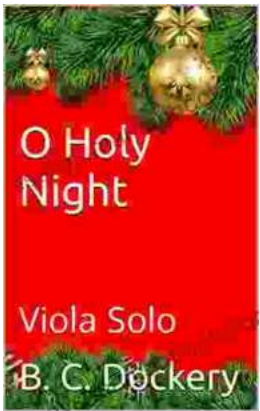
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
