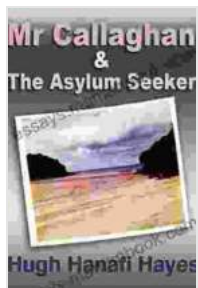


Mr. Callaghan and the Asylum Seeker: A Tale of Humanitarianism and Controversy

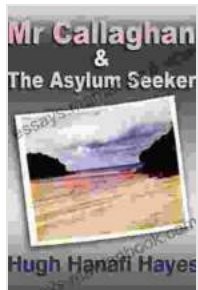

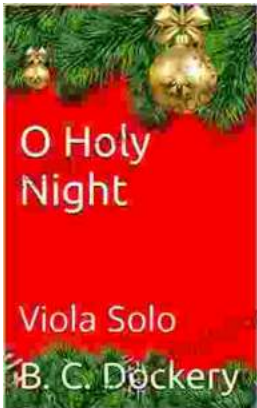
